Anticipated Cost – \$750,000

Purpose – Identify low cost improvements that can be quickly implemented to address current operational and safety deficiencies.

Route 28

From – South of I-66
To – Liberia Avenue

Total Study Corridor Length - approximately 6.2 miles

Anticipated Schedule

- Study Begin Date – May 2014

Final Recommendations and Report – Fall, 2015,

- VDOT in conjunction with the Cities of Manassas and Manassas Park and the Counties of Fairfax and Prince William are undertaking the development of a traffic operational and safety study to identify short term improvements to improve traffic operations on Route 28 (Centreville Road) from south of I-66 to Liberia Ave.

Study Description

The study will identify low cost improvements that can be quickly implemented to address operational and safety issues along this stretch of Route 28. Improvements to be targeted will require minimal right-of-way and have few utility conflicts.

An analysis of existing operational and safety conditions led to a range of potential improvements including:

- Lane and turn lane extensions
- Changes in lane use
- Signal phasing and timing improvements
- Pavement marking and signing improvements
- Pedestrian and bicycle facility improvements

The purpose of this meeting is to solicit feedback on the early action candidate improvements recommendation. Citizen input will be used to guide the project prioritization process.

Environmental Review

Pursuant to the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and 23 CFR 771 for federal aid projects, this study will not impact the human and natural environments to qualify for a Blanket Categorical Exclusion (BCE) under a Programmatic Agreement between the Federal Highway Administration – Virginia Division and the Virginia Department of Transportation effective May 1, 2013.

Right of Way

Potential right-of-way impacts for each of the recommended improvements will be evaluated. As the design for each project is developed, VDOT will determine what right-of-way will be needed to accommodate the construction. Right-of-way and easement information will be presented at future public hearings. Property owners will be notified of the exact location of the right-of-way and easements needed during the right-of-way acquisition process and prior to construction.
