Project Overview



The existing bridge over Big Indian Run.

Anticipated Cost – \$1.88 million

Purpose – To replace the existing substandard bridge and rebuild its approaches

From – 0.04 mile west of Big Indian Run

To – 0.04 mile east of Big Indian Run

Total length – 0.08 mile

Improvements – Construct a new two-lane bridge carrying Route 637 over Big Indian Run

Anticipated Schedule – Public comment ends January 28; right-of-way acquisition and utility relocation, fall 2013; advertisement, fall 2014; construction start, spring 2015

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will replace the Route 637 (Jericho Road) bridge over Big Indian Run in Rappahannock County. The existing bridge, built in 1931, is substandard.

VDOT proposes to construct a new two-lane bridge of prestressed concrete slabs with an asphalt overlay riding surface. The proposed bridge will be 28 feet long, 24 feet wide and will be in the same approximate location as the existing bridge and approaches.

The proposed bridge will be constructed in phases in

order to maintain a single travel lane on the bridge throughout construction. A temporary signal will control two-way traffic through the work zone. A temporary bridge may be utilized to maintain traffic during construction. Construction is anticipated to begin in the spring of 2015 and take 12 to 15 months to complete.

Approximately 250 vehicles use Route 637 daily, according to a 2011 traffic count.

Environmental Review

The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is applicable to this project and a Programmatic Categorical Exclusion (PCE) was developed in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration and in accordance with federal guidelines. The NEPA document includes information from various technical reviews, including those related to natural resources, water quality, threatened and endangered species, air quality, noise, etc. In compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act, Section 106 and 36 CFR Part 800, information concerning the potential effects of the proposed project on properties listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places is also provided in the environmental documentation.

The NEPA document and the results of other environmental studies are available at today's meeting.

Right of Way

As the design is developed, VDOT will determine what right of way and easements will be needed to accommodate the construction. The right of way and easement information will be available at the public hearing on January 16.

The property owners will be notified of the exact location of the right of way and easements needed during the right of way acquisition process and prior to construction.
