Interstate 64 - Double Box Culvert

\$1,539,709

This project rehabilitates a double box culvert under Interstate 64 in the northern corner of the City of Clifton Forge. The box culvert, built in 1971, runs parallel to Route 606. The box culvert works in conjunction with the two I-64 bridges that travel over Route 606.

Completion:

June 9, 2015

During construction there will be a shoulder restriction on Route 606 under I-64. There will be no lane closures on I-64 during construction.

Interstate 64 - Exit 21

Estimated Cost:

\$8,840,000

This is a new project in the Six Year Plan. The project is located in the Low Moor and Selma area of Alleghany County. This project provides an interchange modification at I-64, exit 21 to reduce traffic conflict points and improve traffic capacity. It is anticipated this project will convert to a county Revenue Sharing project to accelerate the project schedule and compliment proposed land development improvements currently under review.

Route 159 (Dunlap Creek Road) - Crow Run Bridge

Contract Value:

\$1,775,343

This project replaces the two-lane bridge on Route 159 over Crow Run. The project is 0.1-mile long extending from 0.45-mile west of Route 717 to 0.55-mile west of Route 717.

Estimated Completion:

Fall 2016

The new structure will be a box culvert with two 11-foot travel lanes and four-foot shoulders. Guardrail is proposed on the four corners of the new structure.
