



Pacific Boulevard (Route 1036) Widening Loudoun County

Find out about the proposed widening of Pacific Boulevard (Route 1036) from two to four lanes between Sterling Boulevard and Relocation Drive in Loudoun County. The project also includes a new sidewalk on the east side of Pacific Boulevard, a multi-use trail on the west side, intersection improvements along Relocation Drive, and a traffic signal at the intersection of Pacific Boulevard and Sterling Boulevard.

Review the project information and environmental document in the form of a Categorical Exclusion at VDOT's Northern Virginia District Office, at 14685 Avion Parkway in Chantilly, VA 20151, 703-383-8368, 1-888-383-VDOT, or TTY/TDD 711. You can also review project information at VDOT's Residency Office at 41 Lawson Road, S.E. in Leesburg, VA 20175, 703-737-2000. Please call ahead to ensure the availability of appropriate personnel to answer your questions.

If your concerns cannot be satisfied, VDOT is willing to hold a public hearing. You may request a public hearing by sending a written request to Mr. James C. Zeller, P.E., Leesburg Preliminary Engineering Manager, VDOT, 41 Lawson Road, S.E., Leesburg, VA 20175 on or prior to **November 27, 2009**. If a request for a public hearing is received, notice of date, time and place of the hearing will be posted.

Through on-site inspection, coordination and correspondence with state and local resource agencies, the Northern Virginia District Environmental Section has determined the project will not impact any streams or wetlands, endangered species, natural, cultural, historic, or recreational resources, and will not involve significant air, noise, or water quality impacts. Pursuant to the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), 23 CFR 771, a Categorical Exclusion (CE) document has been prepared.

In compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act, Section 106 and 36 CFR Part 800, information concerning the potential effects of the proposed project on properties listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places is provided in the environmental documentation.
