## Project Overview



*Hampton Boulevard*

**Anticipated Cost** – \$38 million

**Purpose** – Provide a grade separation between vehicular traffic on Hampton Boulevard and the train traffic into and out of Norfolk International Terminal

**From** – 0.003 mile north of Rogers Avenue

**To** – 0.007 mile south of B Avenue

**Total length** – 0.50 mile

**Improvements** – Two new bridges will be constructed. The first bridge will provide a railroad crossing, and the second bridge will provide vehicle access into Norfolk International Terminal and the U.S. Navy's Gate Six.

# PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Hampton Boulevard Grade Separation Project, designed to improve safety and minimize traffic disruptions due to an existing railroad crossing, will soon begin 0.003 mile north of Rogers Avenue and end 0.007 mile south of B Avenue.

Two new bridges will be constructed as part of the project. The first bridge will provide a new railroad crossing, and the second will provide vehicle access into the Norfolk International Terminal and the U.S. Navy's Gate Six.

The project also will provide improved roadway lighting, signals, drainage, landscaping, bike lanes,

curbs, gutters and sidewalks.

The project will provide a six-lane detour roadway including an adequate median for turn lanes and access into the Norfolk International Terminal and the U.S. Navy's Gate Six, while maintaining the same capacity as the existing Hampton Boulevard. Therefore, construction is expected to pose only minor disruptions to traffic.

The project will cost approximately \$38 million and is scheduled to be completed November 2012.

## Environmental Review

This project has been coordinated through the State Environmental Review Process, and all required environmental documents have been obtained.

## Right of Way

All required right of way and easements have been obtained for construction of the project.
